INDIA'S VACCINE MAITRI

India's Vaccine Maitri (friendship through COVID-19 vaccines), which began in the immediate neighbourhood, starting with the Maldives, Bhutan, Bangladesh, Nepal, Sri Lanka and Myanmar, as also Mauritius and Seychelles, thereafter followed with the extended neighbourhood, especially the Gulf. Supplying smaller and more vulnerable nations was then the logic of reaching out to regions from Africa to the CARICOM. There were also contracts that Indian vaccine manufacturers entered into with other nations. either bilaterally or through the Covax initiative. So far, India has supplied 'Made in India' vaccines to 72 nations across geographies, totalling more than 600 million doses. 




EPISODE HUNGARY DIALOGUE
